Meeting called to order at 1:00pm.

1. Introductions

All in attendance went around the room and introduced themselves:

2. Presentation by Andrea Senft, Manager Community Partnerships, School District 34

Looking Back to Move Forward: Abbotsford's Child and Youth Friendly Strategy.

- Andrea's Powerpoint presentation covered the timeline of Abbotsford's Child and Youth Friendly Strategy development from a commitment made by the Abbotsford Social Development Advisory Committee in 2005 to the release in 2009 of the strategy paper.
- As Andrea reflected on the movement that has been made on those strategies over the past 5 years, she highlighted the challenges associated in securing community buy-in, and ensuring the stated strategies or goals are limited in number and realistic.
- Clear success connected to the 2009 report, has been the development and delivery of an Abbotsford Youth Health Centre – where the community worked proactively with key service partners to deliver a needed service.

- Andrea also shared that she senses a shift in the Abbotsford community towards a greater will to collaborate between a wider range of organizations.
- Andrea handed out pages 34 to 39 of the 2009 strategy document, and opened the floor to comments and questions focussed on: what else have we accomplished? How do we move forward? What do we see as successes? What are next steps for the ACYC?
- Discussion from CYC members indicated an interest in the ACYC supporting priorities that have large community impact, or that support inter-generational projects, or that incorporate the time so that the priority development is intentional and strategic towards working on 'one thing', or that the feedback from children, youth, and families be used to determine best ACYC priorities. However, it was also raised as to whether the ACYC should 'own' any these priorities or strategies. Rather, are they the City's responsibilities? (not sure we want to add this as probably best to build a relationship with the newly appointed..

Action:

- 1. In the upcoming week Louise will summarize some key points from Andrea's presentation and the questions that the Table's are requested to discuss and send to their Chairs.
- 2. Tables will discuss at their next meetings priority areas the ACYC could explore to reinvigorate the intention of the 2009 Abbotsford Child and Youth Friendly Strategy.
- 3. These top priority areas will be sent to Louise by Jan. 20th, 2015 for collation and discussion at Jan. 29th CYC meeting.
- 4. January CYC meeting will discuss Table suggestions with possibility of defining focus for further discussion at ACYC Forum to be held in June

3. Round table - upcoming child, youth, and family focussed events/workshops

- Eric MCFD Safe Relations, Safe Children registration closes Nov. 21st.
 Almost full with nearly 150 registrants. Expected to be an amazing networking event with child and adult serving organizations.
- Pierre –West Abbotsford Community School- is the local Coordinator for the Canadian Tire Jumpstart program. Currently accepting applications for the spring/summer season for children and youth living in Abbotsford and Aldergrove. Applications are accepted for children ages 3 to 18 years who need a subsidy to participate in sporting, cultural or other group activities (e.g. hockey, dance, Scouts). Up to \$175/child is available. Pierre can be contacted for more information (pierre@westabby.org).
- Sharon Crowley Literacy Matters Annual reading challenge will be held January 24th. Aboriginal Parents as Literacy Supporters (APALS) will have a community launch on Jan. 21st.
 - Sharon requested consideration by other CYC members of supporting an adult learning centre to fill the gap for those people unable to meet Bakerview's entry criteria.

- There is a need for a consistent, dedicated space for such a centre, as well as support for resources that could provide childminding, life coaching, and parenting. Shairose suggested Sharon connect with Abbotsford Works.
- Bev Abbotsford Youth Commission Girls Night Out/Boys Night Out –an 8
 week program that introduces youth to different activities in a supportive
 environment. Youth must find own transport to the different activity venues. This
 programming qualifies for Canadian Tire Jumpstart funding.
- Maria CCRR, Abbotsford Community Services a large selection of inexpensive workshops (\$10/workshop) will be offered January to March, 2015. Topics include self-regulation with Debbie Macnamara, and Mother Goose with Jane Cobb.
- Denise Success by Six/Abbotsford Early Childhood Ctte Will be working with school district to deliver the Middle Years Info Night on Feb 19th. The Early Years Info Night has been postponed as not enough vendors could be secured.
- Brian IMPACT/VYPER 8 week long parent groups will start again in January. Provides a connection between youth and parents. VYPER is accepting minigrant applications. VYPER staff are available to assist in developing grant applications and there is now a cohort of youth available and interested in supporting community projects. University of Fraser Valley is hosting a social work conference April 28th to May 1st a component will have a youth led session.
- Shairose Abbotsford Community Services ACS is hosting the extreme weather shelter for December, and looking for volunteers. Shifts run from 7pm to 7am. Contact is Neil Stark – neil.stark@abbotsfordcommunityservices.com

Special Needs Table (represented by Special Needs Advisory Ctte (SNAC)) – Kathleen Praxl

- Meet every two months. Last meeting on November 19th and next meeting will be on January 21st at Pivot Point at 10am. SNAC has parents involved in its Committee and these parents have been providing critical energy in the work of SNAC.
- SNAC is sponsoring a Transition Fair (similar to the Connection Fair) on Saturday, March 7th from 1 to 4pm.
 - Service providers who work with special needs youth who are transitioning to adult services (e.g. clients are those with mental disabilities, FAS). Each provider will show 5 slides in 5 minutes to provide information on how they serve youth with special needs.
 - They also have space for 10 organizations to participate with information tables. All are asked to provide a \$25 value door prize in lieu of a table fee.
 - Audience for the Fair are expected to be families with youth who will be transitioning soon, but Fair is also open to families with special needs children so they can be introduced to some of the considerations and services needed by special needs youth as they transition to adulthood.

6. . ACYC rack cards - Louise

- ACYC membership was asked to comment on the look and content of the draft rack card. Support for the rack card concept was positive and it was suggested to include a sentence on who attends a CYC meeting – what a participant's

7. Revised CYC Forum proposal - Louise

- Louise outlined a revised proposal that had been submitted to the United Way
 of the Fraser Valley for funding to support a 2015 CYC Forum. This forum is
 proposed to be to a smaller audience, focussed on the follow-up regarding the
 2009 Abbotsford Child and Youth Friendly Strategy, and a half-day offering.
- Louise asked for the CYC membership's preference for session to be held on the May 8th or June 1st Pro-D days. June 1st was chosen.
- Louise asked for participants for the Organizing Committee Denise suggested herself and Andrea. Louise will follow-up with them in January.
