1. Welcome: Round table introductions

2. Bikers Against Child Abuse Presentation (1:15 – 1:45pm)

BACA is a safe environment for children, with the goal of taking away childrens' fear of their offender. BACA works with local agencies, creating partnerships in order to keep our children safe. There is a 24/7 helpline (604-807-4340) that gets regular calls from Victim Services, parents, grandparents and children. The team needs to verify the parent/guardian, having the child's consent. Once confirmed (with the child and parents/guardian), a home visit will take place with at least two BACA volunteers (who will be the child's primary contacts). There will be an introduction to one another; with the child receiving a teddy bear, denim biker vest and dog tags with their primary contacts' names and phone number included. There will never be just one BACA volunteer with the child, and the parents will always be informed when a meeting is taking place. BACA wants the child to start choosing for themselves, and BACA focusing completely on the child's success.

BACA is looking for referrals, trying to help as many children as possible.

- Cases range from children age 3 18 years old
- There are 7 chapters in BC
- BACA is in 13 countries, with over 300 chapters world-wide
- BACA was formed in 1995 in the USA

If you'd like to be a BACA member, there is extensive training:

- 39 webinars, as well as quarterly training
- Criminal Record Check (has to be done once per year)
- Attend meetings
- There is a minimum of 15 months training before full board approval to become a member

May 18th – BACA is having their annual 100 Mile Ride to raise awareness for child abuse

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3. Opportunity to highlight your upcoming child, youth, and family focused events/workshops.

Abbotsford Community Services

- ACS is celebrating their 50th year! Walter Paetkau has written a book on the 50 year history of ACS, with a Book Launch event on May 4th from 2:00 – 4:00pm at the Reach Gallery
- Youth Resource Centre: Parent of Teen group starting early May, and are now taking referrals. Healthy Relationships group is in the works, and will likely run in the summer with activities as well. YRC is have discussion with AYC and the schools to bring their groups there in order to reach more youth. Bridges funding has ended, and there is no ability to serve youth out of care with outreach-based individualized services anymore.
- Foundry: YMind is looking for participants 18-30 years old, coping skills for mild to moderate
 anxiety, depression, etc. based on mindfulness. There is a new peer support worker, so
 there are now 3 youth working as Foundry peer supports, and will soon be posting for a
 family/parent peer support worker. Foundry has an activities Forecast on their Facebook
 page.

Abbotsford Restorative Justice

 ARJ have partnered with UFV to create a healthy relationships program into the schools, with topics on consent, skills-based, etc.
